I mailed, emailed, and faxed a four-page letter to all members of the House of Representatives giving grounds for impeaching Chief Judge Robert Katzmann of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit. On August 20, Congressman Mike Thompson sent a letter to me with a copy to Ms. Clarke saying that Ms. Clarke should address my concerns. On August 23, I faxed and mailed a letter to Ms. Clarke requesting a meeting with her or her staff. On August 29, I called her Brooklyn office and requested a response by email, telephone, or in writing. To date, there has been no response from Ms. Clarke.

I submitted a misconduct complaint against a U. S. District Judge for failing to sign the default judgment I submitted in a First Amendment lawsuit I filed against the General Counsel and President of Columbia University, and the Attorney Grievance Committee of the New York State Unified Court System. The lawsuit arose because the General Counsel responded to my offer to give a lecture/lesson on God's existence by threatening me with legal action if I contacted anyone at Columbia U. with my offer. Ms. Clarke should take an interest in this matter, not because Judge Katzmann should be impeached, but because the behavior of all the defendants and judges in this case sheds light on the conflicts in the United States rooted in religion.
